Typical Industry Requirements for Business Licenses



You're about to start a business, but before you open your doors, it's critical to secure all the required business licenses. Determining what you need, though, can take you through a perplexing labyrinth of rules, regulations, and interpretations dictated by local, county, state, and federal governments.

Here are a few of the licensing requirements for some common industries:



Supermarkets

Likely number of business licenses per location: 20

One common license is the Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act (PACA) license which lets you sell fresh or frozen fruits and vegetables. Several others are required to sell things like alcohol or even lottery tickets.



Convenience Stores

Likely number of business licenses per location: 10

A corner convenience store requires several different licenses to operate because it has a wide variety of products. These can include tobacco and fuel, but also specialty items like bait and prepared foods.



General Retail

Likely number of business licenses per location: 1-

A general retail store will require a standard business license, but it may vary depending on city, county, and state laws.



Restaurants

Likely number of business licenses per location: 6

Like most workplaces, opening a restaurant requires a business license, but it will also need a food service license and in many cases an alcohol license.



Construction/Contracting

Likely number of business licenses per location: 10

In most places, a construction or contracting company requires having a general business license. Other specialties will also need separate licenses to perform their work.



Hospitality

Likely number of business licenses per location: 115

Hotels present a licensing challenge including lodging specific requirements, but also specialty requirements for facilities like a pool, a gym, laundry services, a restaurant, etc.
